What are the components of an apprenticeship program?

- Employment with a sponsoring employer.
- Structured on-the-job training of at least 2,000 hours.
- Related instruction of a minimum of 144 hours or equivalent each year.
- Safety training of at least 50 hours.
- Wages that increase with experience and training.
