Please be advised that the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry is currently surveying wage rates paid on **Commercial, Highway/Heavy, and Residential** construction projects in all 87 counties to determine prevailing wage rates. Please use the attached form or submit your surveys online.

The department requests that all interested parties submit reports of hourly wage rates paid on projects performed during the past twelve months. **If unable to submit surveys online, return the completed Survey Form only.**

To be included in this survey, all reports or projects must be returned within **60 days, by close of business Friday June 2, 2017**. Should you need assistance with the form, please call (651) 284-5091. **Failure to submit a report means that you do not participate in establishing the prevailing wage rate in your area.**

Please read the directions on reverse side of Survey Form carefully.

**IMPORTANT!  
DO NOT USE FORMS FROM PREVIOUS YEARS.**

- Review classification titles for correct reporting. For equipment operators, use the classification code under the Highway/Heavy list 302 – 397 **or** for Commercial or Residential 501 - 550. Paving and grading equipment for all types of construction should be reported using the Highway/Heavy list 302-397.
- You may report a worker more than once; however, only **once per project**.
- Employees reported on the survey must have worked at least **8 hours** on the project reported
- You may report **all work performed on or after April 3, 2016**.
- Highway/Heavy projects may only be reported if the cost of the project is **\$25,000** or more.
- Commercial projects may only be reported if the cost of the project is \$2,500 or more. Commercial construction includes apartment complexes and residential structures of three units or more.
- Residential projects may only be reported if the cost of the project is \$2,500 or more. Residential construction applies to single family and two family homes.
- A separate form is required for each project reported. You may copy the form and **SAVE TIME AND PAPER** by completing the survey electronically.

In determining prevailing rates, employees can be counted more than once, however only once per project. Use a separate form for each project. You may copy the form for your use. Report construction performed in the previous twelve months only. You may report either public or private projects. Do not report owners, foreman, supervisors, apprentices, or helpers.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1) Employer's name.
- 2) For each project reported, indicate its location by Street Address, CITY AND COUNTY and give a brief description of the work performed.
- 3) Project description (*check one*).
- 4) Enter approximate cost of the project.
- 5) **PLEASE PRINT OR TYPE** the name of all the employees who worked on the project. **Employees reported on Commercial, Residential, or Highway/Heavy projects must have worked at least 8 hours on the project.**
- 6) From the Master Job Classification listed below, select the class of labor in which the employee worked the greatest number of hours on the project.
- 7) Basic hourly rate less fringe benefits.
- 8) List the **TOTAL HOURLY FRINGE BENEFIT RATE**. Include health and welfare, pension, vacation, holidays, apprentice or training funds or other direct employee benefits. DO NOT include industry funds, workers' or unemployment compensation, subsistence or travel pay, or similar allowances.
- 9) Total hourly wage plus fringes.
- 10) **SIGN and DATE**. Incomplete forms will be returned. If submitting online, the name of the person attesting must be inserted twice, once on the "submitted by" line and once on the "signature" line.
